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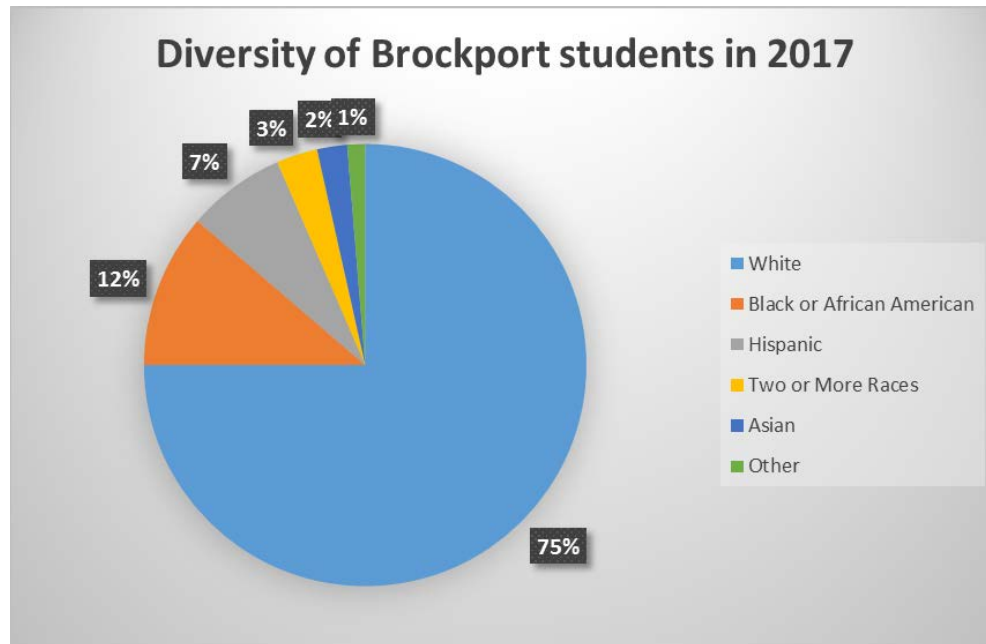

- Develop a local, digital teaching, learning, scholarship repository

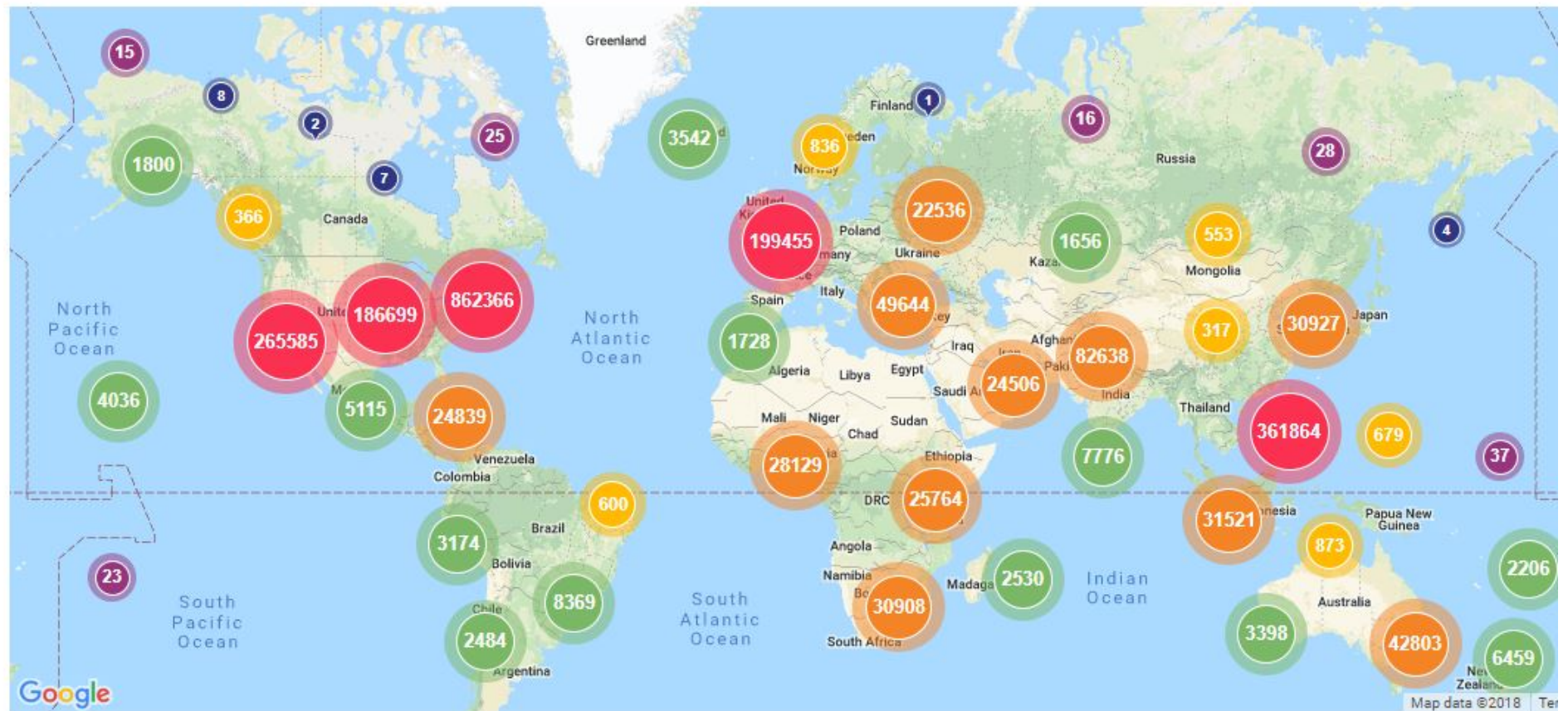


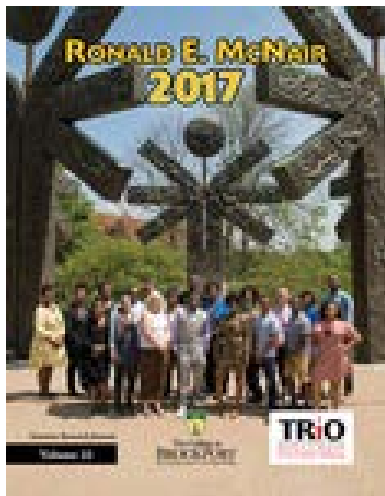
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Digital Commons at Brockport – 3 million downloads, 232 countries

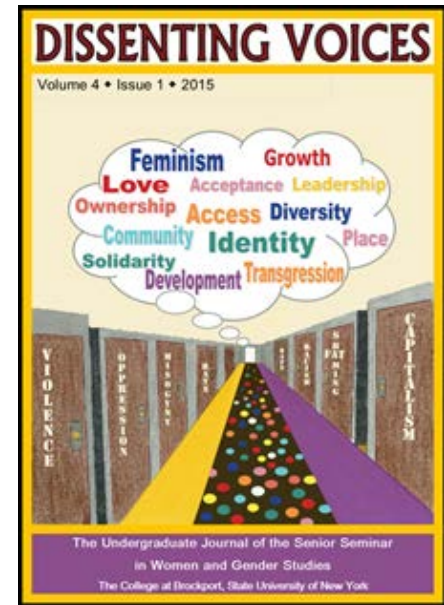
Top 5 countries – United States, Philippines, United Kingdom, Canada, India

Lessons Learned

1. Look for a need to fill – whose voices aren't being heard?
2. Tie collections to institutional goals – especially diversity goals
3. Outreach is essential – read campus newsletters (Daily Eagle), social media
4. Membership on Diversity Conference committee led to several collections
5. Invite those with diverse backgrounds to library advisory committees, editorial boards, etc.



Where do we go from here?

- Reaching beyond the repository to a Digital Scholarship Center
- Digital Humanities projects such as Veterans Day transcriptions
- More scholarship from the creative disciplines – dance, arts, etc.
