Statement on the Vietnam Moratorium as Presented:

Whereas, the war in Vietnam is worthy of national examination and debate, and

Whereas, many students and faculty members are deeply concerned about this issue,
Therefore, Be It

Resolved, that the Faculty Senate expresses its support of the October 15 moratorium
on Vietnam insofar as it provides an opportunity for meaningful debate, and be
it further

Resolved, that academic freedom includes the freedom to participate in any peaceful
manner in the October 15 moratorium or not to participate.
