

Enabling Legislation regarding the New Faculty Senate

Now that the Faculty-at-Large has approved the revised Constitution of the Faculty, the Committee on the Revision of the Constitution recommends the following enabling legislation:

I. The committee on Nominations and Elections shall divide the terms of Senators into one and two year categories in order to ensure continuity in the Senate. This applies only to elections for September 1970. Allotment of the representation shall generally be as follows:

- A. Units having an even number of Senators--2, 4, 6, etc.-- shall have one half two-year seats and one half one-year seats.
- B. Units having an uneven number of Senators--3, 5, 7, etc.-- shall have one seat placed into a common pool from which the Committee shall determine their terms. Otherwise the method of dividing seats as outlined in point A. shall apply.
- C. Units having one Senator shall have, whenever possible, two-year seats.

II. Current Senators-at-Large and Senators representing Divisions whose offices expire June 30, 1971, shall have the opportunity to serve out their terms. They cannot concurrently serve in their offices and in the capacity as Senators under the d'Hondt method of representation.

III. Members of the Committees on Nominations and Elections, on Appointments and Promotions, and on Grievances whose terms of office extend beyond June 30, 1970, shall be urged to fulfill their terms.

IV. Academic Departments and other units of representation under the revised Constitution are encouraged to assist Senators by providing secretarial help and by facilitating means of communicating issues relating to the Senate.

V. At the first meeting of the Faculty Senate in the Fall Semester, 1970, nominations for members to serve on the Committee on Committees shall be made from the floor and elections shall subsequently follow.
