WHEREAS the Faculty Senate is empowered to discuss and express its views on any matter of general college concern, and

WHEREAS the Faculty Senate Committees on Environment and Undergraduate Student Policies have been examining the Residence Hall environment, and

WHEREAS Dr. Patrick Smith, Vice President for Student Affairs, has established an Advisory Committee on the Quality of Residence Hall Environment which is presently considering recommendations for changes in residence hall regulations and procedures,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Faculty Senate recognizes that the dormitory environment has a direct effect upon the quality of academic life and, therefore, supports the establishment of this committee to address these concerns.
