ESTABLISHING A NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Resolution for: The establishment of local chapters of National Honor Societies at the State University of New York College at Brockport.

Rationale: Although numerous, if not most, of our academic departments are affiliated with professional fraternities, honor societies, or recognition societies appropriate to a discipline, there is no society recognizing general scholarship. Establishing a general honor society on campus will:

1. recognize scholarship of superior quality
2. encourage the production of superior scholarship as an accomplishment to be valued

WHEREAS a vital and effective college promotes academic excellence and scholarship in all of its students;

WHEREAS a general National Honor Society provides all students an opportunity to achieve recognition of their academic excellence and scholarship;

WHEREAS the establishment of a local chapter of a general National Honor Society will have a positive impact on student recruitment and retention;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Faculty Senate supports the establishment of local chapters of National Honor Societies at Brockport.
