Policy Regarding Admission of Undergraduate with Non-matriculated Credit

Credit for courses taken at Brockport by a non-matriculated undergraduate student will be treated as transfer credit when that student is admitted as a matriculated student to the college.*

Rationale:

1. The proposed policy is needed to correct an inequity which may put the non-matriculated student at a disadvantage when compared with any other category of admitted or readmitted student.
2. While the proposed policy is not designed expressly to encourage non-matriculated students to apply for admission, its result will be to do so.

*To be added to a new section of The Student Handbook for Non-matriculated Undergraduate Students, which will include all policies pertinent to these students.
