Resolution on Women's and Minority Studies

WHEREAS: Over the past several decades, scholarly activities in minority and women's studies have been of such volume and high quality as to remove any doubt of their legitimacy as appropriate and accepted disciplines within the University;

THEREFORE, be it resolved that SUNY College at Brockport endorses the position that when considering the status of faculty for promotion, reappointment, continuing appointment, and/or discretionary salary increases, records of scholarly activity, teaching, and University and community service in the disciplines of minority or women's studies should be judged on a par with all the traditionally recognized fields of study.
