Senate Resolution on Admissions Requirements

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the following academic requirements be established for graduating high school seniors entering as non-EOP freshmen for 1990:

A minimum of 17 academic units, including:

Four units of English

Four units of social studies

Two units of college preparatory mathematics

Two units of college preparatory science, including one in a laboratory science

One unit of course work in the fine arts

Four additional academic units, which may include foreign languages, additional mathematics, science, English or social studies, or fine arts-with no more than two units above the minimum requirement in any one area.
