RESOLUTION ON THE
RE-CALCULATION OF OVERALL HIGH SCHOOL AVERAGES

WHEREAS SUNY College at Brockport is the only SUNY College which currently re-calculates a majority of its freshman applicants' overall high school grade averages as standard procedure,

and

WHEREAS a study has shown that the impact of this re-calculation on approximately 75% of all regularly admitted freshmen is to change their overall high school average less than 1%,

and

WHEREAS the Brockport Faculty Senate recently passed a resolution increasing the minimum number of academic units required of entering non-EOP freshmen from 14 academic units to 17, making the task of re-calculation more time consuming and thus more costly,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Admissions Office not re-calculate high school averages submitted by candidates for regular admission except in such cases where re-calculation is necessary to determine eligibility for regular admission to the College.
