RESOLUTION

400/500 LEVEL "SWING" COURSES

from

GRADUATE CURRICULUM AND POLICIES COMMITTEE

WHEREAS graduate and undergraduate levels of study have always been clearly distinguished by their separate degrees,

and

WHEREAS SUNY College at Brockport recognizes this distinction of 400 numbered undergraduate courses from 500 numbered graduate courses by the course registration form listing of the level of additional work required for the 500 version,

therefore

BE IT RESOLVED THAT students may not receive credit for a 500-level course ("swing" courses) if they already have credit for the corresponding 400-level version. *That is, (a) no 400-course credit may be upgraded to the 500 level by the completion of the additional work, and (b) if credit at the 400 level exists on the student's transcript, the student may not register for the 500-level version.*
