Graduate Admissions Categories
(amended 10/30/00)

REGULAR ADMISSION: Matriculation in a degree program without reservation, indicating a sound academic background in preparation for a specific program of graduate study.

CONDITIONAL ADMISSION: Departments may offer matriculation into a degree program on a conditional basis. Students admitted on a conditional basis will be apprised in writing of the conditions they must fulfill in order to achieve regular admission status. The maximum number of credits can be earned while in conditional status is 12. Any student who earns a grade less than a B in a graduate course, while a conditional status, will be dismissed from graduate study.

NON-DEGREE STATUS: Non-degree status provides the opportunity for students to enroll on a non-matriculated basis in graduate courses for which they have the prerequisites and interest. Non-degree status requires completion of a brief application form and an official transcript documenting a bachelor's degree. If a transcript is not available at the time of registration, students will be given 30 days from the beginning of the semester to provide it. If a transcript has not been provided by the end of a semester, the student's record will be blocked and no subsequent enrollment allowed. A maximum of 9 credits taken at SUNY Brockport in a non-degree status may be credited towards a graduate degree program.
