The Alcohol and Substance Abuse Studies Program (ASAP) may be pursued as a track of the Liberal Arts program in Health Science, as a complete set of electives to compliment another major, as a complete set of courses for a non-matriculated student, or selectively as independent electives. HLS 418 is a pre-requisite or co-requisite for all other ASAP courses. Our department's request involves removing HLS 306 from the curriculum and substituting HLS 488 instead. There would not be any change in the total credits necessary to complete the program.
