### CMC 111

Whereas planning time is critical for solid implementation of the course CMC 111, and

Whereas time is also needed to hire the additional faculty required for implementation of the required number of sections of that course,

Therefore be it resolved that the General Education Committee endorses the proposed one-year delay in implementation (to begin Fall 2002) of that requirement.

### MTH 112

Whereas planning time is critical for solid implementation of the course MTH 112, and

Whereas time is also needed to hire the additional faculty required for implementation of the required number of sections of that course,

Therefore be it resolved that the General Education Committee endorses the proposed one-year delay in implementation (to begin Fall 2002) of that requirement.

### Competency Exams Delay: Writing and Math Skills

Whereas the planning and development time used for the Computer Skills Competency Exam has had very good results, and

Whereas similar planning and development time is needed to achieve the same good results in the other competency exams in Writing Skills and Math Skills,

Therefore be it resolved that the General Education Committee endorses the proposed one-year delay in implementation (to begin with freshmen and transfers entering in Fall 2002) of the Writing Skills Competency exam, and the two-year delay in implementation (to begin with freshmen and transfers entering in Fall 2003) of the Math Skills Competency Exam.
